
Key Stage 1— Autumn 1st- Amazing Australia



Session 1: Science — Nature Trail Journey Stick LO: I am learning to observe changes across the four seasons.

The children will go into the forest and will look for evidence of what season it is. They will collect their evidence in the form of a journey stick.



Session 2: Science - Rain, rain, go away! LO: I am learning to observe and describe weather associated with the seasons.

The children will create their own rain gauges using recycled plastic bottles. The children will start a daily weather report.



Session 3: Science — Daylight Graph

LO: I am learning to observe how day length varies.

The children will create a graph of daylight hours for each season. They will discuss the differences between each season.



Session 4: Science — Tree Types

LO: I am learning to identify and name a variety of plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees.

The children will sort some leaves by colours and shapes. Children to go to the forest to see if they can spot deciduous and evergreen trees.



Session 5 : Science—Hibernation and Migration LO: I am learning to understand how animals

adapt to the changing seasons.

The children will look at how different animals respond to different seasons. Compare how a robin and a hedgehog respond to the different seasons.




Session 6 Science—Data Collection

LO: I am learning to record and discuss simple data.

The children will use the data they have collected from their rain gauges across the previous two weeks to create a bar graph.
