


Pop Art comes from the word Popular because he used everyday items such as soup cans and soap powder as inspiration for his work, as well as celebrities including Marilyn Monroe and Elvis Presley.


Warhol's work is typically bold and brightly coloured with simple shapes often resembling magazine adverts.

chests of tea into the
water.

Independence Day is celebrated each year in the United States on July 4th. The day is often referred to as the Fourth of July.
